# Re-use cascade training session plan



### **Theme**

**Disposal** 

# **Objectives**

To make participants think about the options for disposal of household items and identify organisations that will take those items.

#### **Outcomes**

To come away with a list of organisations where you can donate items for re-use now and in the future.

#### You will need

- Paper and pens
- · Computer/phone
- Internet access/wifi



## Instructions for the group

To produce a list of organisations where you can donate your unwanted household items as follows (feel free to add anything to the list that you feel is missing)

- Clothing
- Furniture
- Kitchen Equipment
- Computers
- Phones
- Garden equipment e.g. lawnmowers, hedge trimmers etc
- Wood (such as an old fence)
- Bras (women only)
- Jewellery
- Or anything else you can think of.

Optional: You might want to go one step further and use the session to start off developing a local re-use guide that you can share with others. A great example is the one created by Greener Kirkcaldy: greenerkirkcaldy.org.uk/kirkcaldy-reuse-and-repair-guide/
