


The amount of litter in **Scotland**

What's on our streets? The most commonly littered items in Scotland:













Answers:

Each year, Scotland's cleaning teams collect 15,000 tonnes of litter.

That's:

the same weight as 50 individual Kelpies.

around 250 million items of litter.

enough to fill 570,000 wheelie bins.

around 50 pieces of litter for every person in Scotland (on average).

Out of lockdown, 475 items dropped every minute (on average).

Local authorities have to spend millions cleaning up litter – at least £46 million each year, around £20 per taxpayer.
